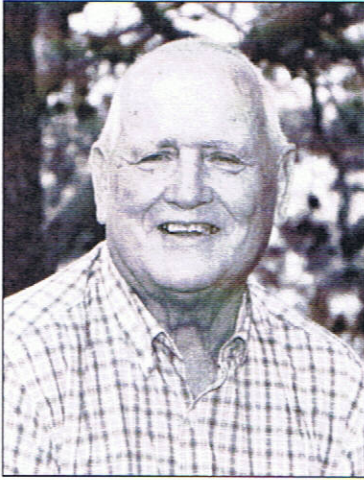




Stillwater Pioneer Athlete Memorial
